
The closing ceremony was graced by esteemed guests, including leaders from HSBC and the Association's team. As a gesture of support, HSBC donated 200 canes to the Association.

LAUNCH OF PYTHON CODING COURSE!



The Blind Relief Association launched a Python programming course for visually impaired students and trainees. This pilot project aims to empower individuals with the skills to pursue further education and career opportunities in technology.

The program was formally inaugurated on 16 August 2024 by Shri K. C. Pande, Executive Secretary who introduced the trainees to Python programming and its advantages. Mr. Arman will serve as the guide for the course.

The Python programming course is free and will run until March 2025. The course is divided into two batches - Batch One: JPM School students from Class IX to Class XII and Batch Two: Visually impaired individuals with prior knowledge of basic computer skills.

By providing training in Python programming, the Association aims to equip participants with specific knowledge that can help them gain secure job positions in this area of technology. Thanks to Ameya Meattle for helping in design and implementing this training program

JANMASHTAMI CELEBRATIONS

Krishna Janmashtami is a very special occasion celebrated with two days of festivities organized by the students of Class XII of JPM Senior Secondary School. The festivities commenced with a havan on the 25th of August evening followed by a 24-hour recitation of the Ramcharitmanas. The students, alumni, volunteers, and staff took turns enthusiastically reciting the sacred text accompanied by music.

VISITORS FROM THE NATIONAL DIET OF JAPAN


On 29 August 2024, Honorable Mr. Kazuhiko Aoki, Mr. Shigeharu Aoyama, and Mr. Kaneshige Wakamatsu, members of the House of Councilors from the National Diet of Japan visited the "Power of Touch" Massage Kiosk at Shivaji Stadium Metro Station, New Delhi to see the activities of the visually impaired masseurs trained by the Blind Relief Association, Delhi.

The Kiosk space has been made available courtesy of Delhi Metro which has been a recipient of Japanese ODA (Official Development Assistance) extended through JICA (Japan International Corporation Agency).

The masseurs working in the Kiosk have received training in Shiatsu from a Japanese trainer Mr. Hisashi Seiki a Senior JOCV dispatched by JICA for 2 years. The "Power of Touch" Massage Kiosk thus represents a small but unique symbol of India-Japan cooperation in the area of skill development and empowerment of persons with visual disabilities.

The delegation was accompanied by officials of the Embassy of Japan and JICA and was received by Mr. K.C. Pande, Executive Secretary; Mr. David, Dy. Executive Secretary (Operations) and other team members from the Association.

The members also availed themselves of the head, shoulder, and foot massage. They were greatly impressed by the expertise of the masseurs Mr. Ambika Prasad, Mr. Mohammad Walid Khan, and Ms. Manisha Ghimire.
