On 21st November, the Blind Relief Association's Sawaru Nihongo Team (Japanese Language Classes) participated in Kizuna, a Japanese Cultural Festival organized by JNU's Center for Japanese Studies.

The team performed a heartwarming skit, "Sawaru Nihongo - Zou San," which told the true story of Indira, an elephant sent by Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru to Japan in 1949. The skit highlighted the significance of compassion and cultural connection.

Ajay Gupta, a team member and a peer teacher introduced the team and organization, and the performance was followed by a rendition of the song "Zou San" in Japanese and Hindi. The Sawaru Nihongo team translated the Hindi version, which resonated deeply with the audience.


He along with senior officials of NBCC distributed Braille sheets, t-shirts, mugs, sweets, and stationery to the trainees and officials of the Association.


## TAKLI SPINNING
